| Blackwell (opens 9 a.m. Mondays) | Fenced 10 acres on the south side of Mack Road 0.25 mile east of Route 59 |
| East Branch (opens 9 a.m. Mondays) | Training pond on 60 acres on the west side of Swift Road 1 mile north of North Avenue |
| Greene Valley (opens 10 a.m. Wednesdays) | Fenced 14.5 acres for all dogs and 1.5 acres for small dogs on the east side of Greene Road south of Hobson Road and north of 75th Street |
| Hawk Hollow (opens 10 a.m. Tuesdays) | Fenced 34 acres with two rotating 2.1-acre areas for large dogs and 0.7 acre for small dogs off Bittersweet Drive south of Stearns Road |
| Mayslake (opens 10 a.m. on Thursdays) | Fenced 3.5 acres for all dogs and 0.5 acre for small dogs on the east side of St. Paschal Drive south of 31st Street and west of Route 83 |
| Oldfield Oaks (opens 10 a.m. Tuesdays) | Fenced 6 acres for all dogs and 0.6 acre for small dogs on Cheese Road east of Lemont Road and south of 87th Street |
| Springbrook Prairie (opens 10 a.m. Thursdays) | Fenced 37 acres on the north side of 83rd Street west of Book Road |

Rules and Regulations and Waiver

Please read this information carefully. It includes releases of liability and waiver of legal rights and deprives you of the ability to sue certain parties. By checking the boxes and providing your name and the date, you acknowledge you've read and understood all of the text.

Rules and Regulations

For everyone's safety and enjoyment, you must follow these rules and regulations, which the Forest Preserve District may change at any time. You can bring up to three dogs to an area at one time, but the following applies to each.

- Carry your dog's permit with you when in an off-leash area, and present it to a Forest Preserve District agent for inspection if asked.
- Keep your dog up-to-date on distemper, parvo, and rabies vaccinations and make sure it's wearing its rabies tag on its collar.
- Keep your dog in view and under control at all times and keep a watchful eye on children.
- Close the gate as you enter and exit the off-leash area, and leash your dog when you're outside the area.
- Carry a leash and leash and remove your dog at the first sign of aggression. You are responsible for the behavior of your dog and for any injuries or damages it causes to people or other dogs.
- Do not allow your dog to approach uniformed staff. Leash your dog if necessary.
- Never bring your dog if it's sick or in heat.
- Do not allow your dog to dig holes.
- Properly pick up and dispose of all dog waste. Failure to do so could result in fines up to \$120.
- Keep out of ponds or other waters; they are for dogs only.
- Do not bring a toy that's smaller than a tennis ball. If you bring any toys or treats, do not give them to other dogs, and make sure to take them with you when you leave.
- Never use animals — dead or alive — for any purpose.
- Never use ammunition or devices that use explosive forces to propel retrievable objects.

There is one exception to this rule. At the off-leash area at East Branch Forest Preserve, you may — for dog-training purposes only and with extreme caution — use blank ammunition or devices that use explosive forces to propel retrievable objects.

By checking the box below I agree to abide by these rules and regulations as well as all Forest Preserve District ordinances and administrative orders and state statutes. I understand that the Forest Preserve District may fine me or revoke my permit without refunding my permit fee if I supply false information on this application or fail to comply with any rules, regulations, ordinances, orders or statutes.
