On behalf of the Friends of the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County’s Board of Directors, I am pleased to present our annual report for 2016.

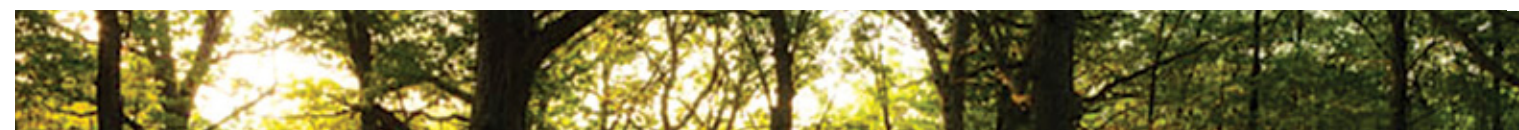

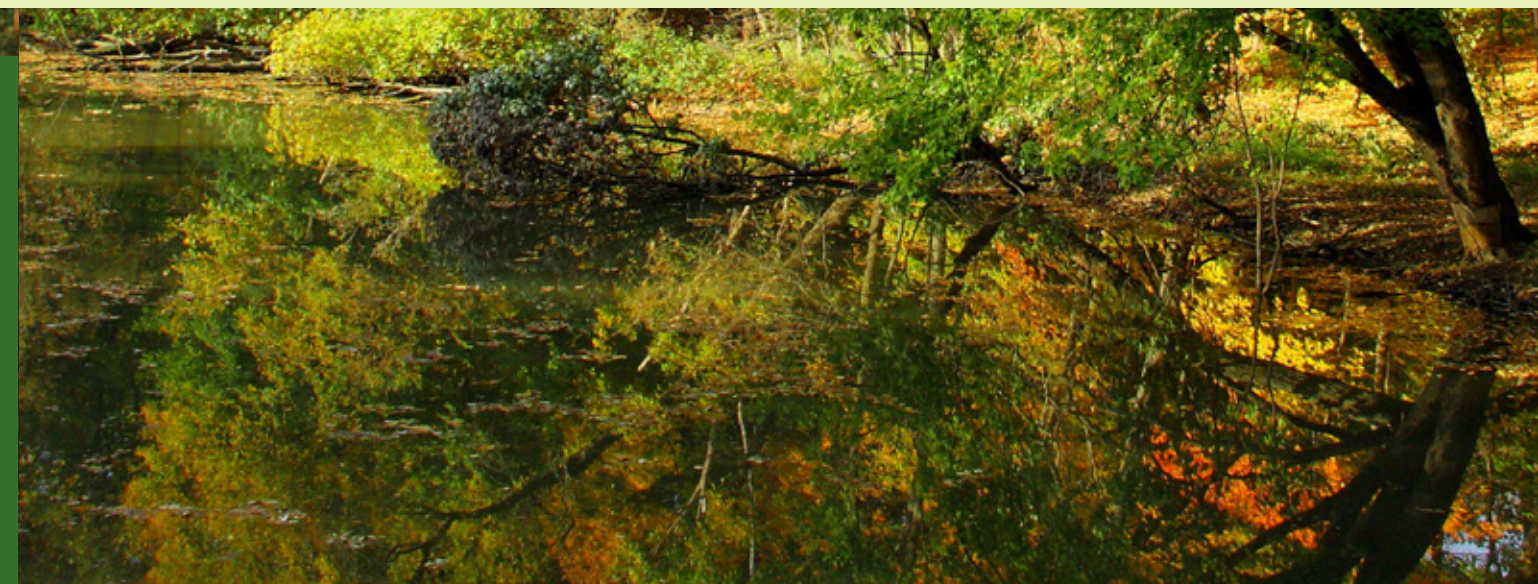

The Friends of the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County exists to advance the vision of the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County through philanthropic endeavors.

2016 Accomplishments

- Served hot chocolate to more than 400 guests at Wonders of Winter at Mayslake Peabody Estate in February
- Repaid the remainder of a \$47,382 interest-free loan from the Forest Preserve District, which helped launch the Friends foundation



- Received a \$500 Next Generation Initiative group grant and \$300 in individual gifts from the DuPage Foundation, whose members also helped collect 27 bags of refuse at “Helping Hands at Herrick Lake” in April
- Received an appreciation award from the Forest Preserve District at the agency’s volunteer banquet in April
- Hosted more than 120 donors at the hospitality receptions at Family Field Day at St. James Farm and Danada Fall Festival at Danada Equestrian Center



the Sierra Club River Prairie Group and individual donors to purchase a programming trailer for Forest Preserve District rangers to use as a mobile learning lab at special events, programs, camps, and traveling programs at schools and libraries

- Supported Willowbrook Wildlife Center fans and avid bicyclists on a one-day 100-mile “Ride for Wildlife” fundraiser along the DuPage Forest Preserves Century Trail in support of the center

- Transferred more than \$29,000 to Mayslake Peabody Estate to benefit the rear courtyard restoration project

- Accepted \$6,000 from the Mary J. Demmon Private Foundation to cover medical expenses for the horses at the Danada Equestrian Center

- Received a grant from the CNH Industrial Foundation (part of the Case IH brand) to help fund an addition at the indoor riding arena at St. James Farm as well as safety-code, energy-efficiency and public-access improvements to the building

- Accepted \$5,206 in stock certificates — the foundation’s first donation of its kind — to fund the restoration of photos and library shelving at Mayslake Peabody Estate with remaining, unused dollars to support additional work at the estate

- Received nearly \$4,000 from the Wheaton Whole Foods Market’s Community Support Day



- Received bait, equipment and prizes from Cabela’s in Hoffman Estates for several Forest Preserve District events and the Take 5 Photo Contest

- Received \$1,315 from tribute contributions to stock Pickerel Lake at Pratt’s Wayne Wood Forest Preserve as a special memorial in honor of a visitor who enjoyed fishing at the preserve

- Sponsored commemorative wine glass gifts for 200 guests at Willowbrook Wildlife Center’s Night Owl Benefit, which raised funds in September for new raptor housing and celebrated the center’s 60th year of helping orphaned and injured native wildlife

- Received \$4,000 from ComEd for new raptor housing at Willowbrook Wildlife Center and restoration efforts at West Chicago Prairie Forest Preserve

- Held the foundation’s annual meeting on Nov. 15, 2016, National Philanthropy Day, a chance for board members, donors, and Forest Preserve District commissioners, volunteers, and employees to visit and learn about current projects and the year’s accomplishments

- Welcomed Brian Battle of Wheaton and Dr. Shannon Burns of Warrenville to the Board of Directors



Ambassadors Circle

In 2016, 153 donors contributed \$100 or more, making each of them a part of the Friends’ Ambassadors Circle. It was the first year more than 100 people participated at this level.

The Friends offered a variety of experiences to Ambassadors Circle donors during the year, including those listed below. Each was a way to thank them for their support, enrich their memories in the forest preserves, increase their involvement in Forest Preserve District activities and encourage them to visit new preserves.

- Celebration of Open Lands Day marked by collecting seeds and placing new prairie plants at Springbrook Prairie Forest Preserve

Finances Jan. 1 – Dec. 31, 2016

Since its inception in 2010, the 501(c)(3) Friends of the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County has accepted tax-deductible gifts for priority projects, favorite forest preserves, natural-resource initiatives and other projects in need of financial support.

In 2016 the Friends raised \$98,260.61 in cash and \$3,913 in in-kind donations and closed the year with a balance of

\$230,225.96. The foundation received a total of 489 gifts, an increase of more than 150 percent over 2015. It also received more online gifts than any other year, including \$1,105 from 12 employer-funded matching-gift programs. \$38,497.92 in expenditures supported projects as designated by donors.
