The health and safety of forest preserve staff and visitors are our top priorities, which is why we continue to follow CDC recommendations related to slowing the spread of COVID-19.

Recently, the CDC has updated their guidelines to include verbiage regarding pets specifically stating, "do not let pets interact with people or other animals outside the household." The CDC further states patrons should "avoid dog parks or public places where a large number of people and dogs gather."
