COVID-19 Guidelines

Governor J.B. Pritzker's Stay at Home Order permits Illinois residents to leave their residence to take part in essential activities, including camping, so long as residents comply with these guidelines. These guidelines apply to recreational camping at the Blackwell Family Campground

- Campers assume personal responsibility and should abide by set guidelines
- If campers are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 or have been in contact with someone who is experiencing symptoms - they should not stay at the campground
- All campers are required to reserve camping online prior to arrival. No walk-up reservations will be accepted. You can purchase permits [online](#) 24/7 or call or visit Visitor Services at 630-933-7248.
- Campers are encouraged to wear a facemask covering when interacting with the campground attendant or other visitors.
- No group or youth group camps
- The preserve is open one hour after sunrise until sunset. Please ensure you are in your campsite before the preserve closes at sunset.
- Campsites can only accommodate registered occupants. No outside visitors or guests will be allowed during this time.
- Campfires and picnic tables are limited to those occupying that campsite only.
- Firewood is available for \$7/bundle. A self-serve cash box will be available for all purchases. Please have exact change.

Safety and Cleansing Precautions:

- Campground attendant building will have a protective barrier to ensure a contactless transaction
- All campground attendants must wear a facemask covering their nose and mouth when handling a transaction or dealing with campers person-to-person
- Campground attendants will be required to wear safety gloves when handling transactions
- Social distancing measures of 6 feet remain in effect and should be observed

- Campers are encouraged to use any self-contained restroom in their own camper for restroom or shower use
- Sinks and flush toilets will be open in the shower building and will be cleaned a minimum of twice daily.
- Showers, water fountains and latrines are closed during this time.
