Bark the outer most layer of a tree which protect the tree from fire or insets and insu-

lates it from extreme heat or cold

Hand drill tool used to make a hole in the trunk of a tree

Leaves on the end of branches, can help us tell what kind of tree it is

Mokuk a birch bark container

Native Americans first people that lived in America

Pioneers the people that came to America to settle

Roots the underground part of a tree that attaches it to the ground and soaks up water

and nutrients for the rest of the plant

Sap the fluid, mostly water with dissolved sugars and minerals that circulates inside the

tree

Sledge type of sled with runners instead of wheels for moving items across snow or

muddy ground

Spile a small wooden or metal spout that allows the sap to drip into a bucket

Syrup sap that has been cooked, making it much stickier and sweeter

Trunk the main woody stem of a tree, from which its branches grow
