Adaptation	a trait or characteristic of an organism that makes it more likely to survive in its environment
Aquatic	an organism that is growing or living in water
Carnivore	an animal that feeds on flesh of other animals
Cold-blooded	relying on the environment to control the inside body temperature
Fangs	long sharp teeth, hollow or grooved teeth of a venomous snake
Habitat	the natural home or environment of an organism
Herbivore	an animal that feeds on plants
Hibernate	to pass the winter in a resting state, to be or become inactive or dormant
Omnivore	an animal that feeds on both animal and plant matter
Predator	an animal that primarily gets food by killing and consuming other animals
Prey	an animal taken by a predator as food
Reptile	the group of vertebrate animals including snakes, lizards, crocodiles, turtles, and tortoises. They are distinguished by having dry scaly skin and typically laying soft-shelled eggs on land.
Scale	one of the thin, flat, rigid plates forming the covering of certain animals, such as snakes, lizards, and fish.
Scute	an external bony or horny plate or large scale, as on a turtle's shell
Shed	to lose old feathers, fur or skin to make way for new growth
Shell	a hard outer covering of an animal, such as a turtle
Terrestrial	an organism that is growing or living on land
Venomous	producing venom in a specialized gland and capable of causing injury or death
